Summary of the 2011 Graduate Survey By FCAE Staff

Where are Agricultural/Horticultural Students after High School Graduation?

Since 1996, the FCAE Staff has collected data from Agriculture/Horticulture teachers regarding high school seniors who were enrolled in at least one Agriculture/Horticulture course during their high school career. Agriculture/Horticulture teachers, with help from guidance counselors, are instrumental in providing this data through the annual graduate survey.

12,386 students were reported through the agricultural education graduate survey this year. This an decrease of 1% over students reported last year. In 2011, 96% (300 of 312) of the schools statewide with Agriculture/Horticulture programs submitted data.

Noteworthy observations and trends are listed below with detailed data included on the following graphs.

- 62% of the students reported (7,579 of 12,245) have enrolled in programs of study at post-secondary institutions. This is a 1% decrease from 2010.
- 73% of the high school agricultural education students enrolled in post-secondary education (5,554 of 7,579) chose to continue their education at a community college; substantiating that high school Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs are key components in community college enrollment. A 1% increase for this percentage.
- 20% of agricultural education students reporting (1,532 of 7,579) are entering an agricultural/horticultural major of study. This is a 1% decrease from 2010.
- 2.5% of the high school agricultural education graduates with an agricultural/horticultural major (38 of 1,532) expressed interest in pursuing a career in Agricultural Education. This represents no change from 2010.
- Increased enrollment in Agricultural Education Teacher Certification Programs continues
 to be a necessity for the future of agriculture education and the agriculture industry.
 Quality Agricultural Education teachers are still needed with an average of 7 retirements,
 5 new programs, and 55 vacancies per year since 2000.
- 55% of the agriculture graduates that expressed interest in agricultural education (21 of 38) are beginning their post-secondary education through community colleges or technical schools. No change from the previous year.
- 38% of agricultural education graduates are entering directly into the workforce (4,666 of 12,245); showing a continued need for workforce preparation. This is a 1% increase from 2010.
- 1.3% of agriculture graduates (165 of 12,245) are going directly into farming; verifying the training in agricultural education programs is not strictly for farming. This small percentage is no change from the 2010 survey.





Workforce Option


Post-Secondary Education Option




